

56th ANNUAL REPORT

The Management Committee of the Red Beach Surf Life Saving Club (Inc) presents for your adoption the 56th Annual Report and Financial Statement for the year ended 30th April 2009.

THE 2008/2009 SEASON

The club has now completed its 56th year of operation and the way in which the season unfolded is documented in the following pages by way of reports and photographs.

The past season has again been tremendously successful for the club. The season's activities have been recorded in the Highlights section on pages 12 & 13.

After many years of waiting for the new deck, a start was made to construction in August 2008 and the project captivated the entire club. Whilst not having access to it until early-February, we can clearly see the potential it offers us.

Friday night meals and Sunday breakfasts are proving very popular and we can but speculate what the coming summer will bring us in terms of diners using the deck.

Membership

Active membership, at 97, is showing the third consecutive increase. There has been a 59% increase in this category since the 2003/04 season when there were 61 active members. The past summer saw five surf boat crews on the water, with crews contributing to the healthy membership numbers.

The Associates/Supporters category is also showing its third consecutive increase in numbers and this can be attributed to signing up members to meet the requirements of our club licence.

JuniorSurf numbers remain healthy and the division can point to its most successful season on record with regard to what was achieved in competition, see page 13.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2008/2009 SEASON

- The sixth annual Pub to Club event from Puhoi to Red Beach took place on Sunday 20th July for single ski and double ski paddlers as well as kayakers.
- Red Beach lifeguard **Erin Taylor** became the first-ever female kayaker to compete for New Zealand at an Olympic Games when she raced in the K1 500m at the Beijing Olympics in August 2008.
- Deck Project: A digger moved onto the clubrooms site on 23rd August 2008 to begin the excavation work for the new deck.
- On September 6th the annual 90 Mile Beach IRB Challenge took place. Three Red Beach crews participated.
- Red Beach members swam in the SLSNR Pool Championships held at the Millennium Centre on Auckland's North Shore on 13th/14th September.
- In September 2008, two Red Beach members were recognised at the SLSNZ Awards function held in Wellington. A Distinguished Service Awards went to Edwin Richards and a Service Award was presented to Michelle Newton.
- The Long Distance Carnival to start the season was held at Orewa in calm conditions on 27.9.08.
- The mass Lifeguard Refresher Day took place at Orewa on Saturday 11th October.
- Red Beach headed off Piha by just 9 secs to win the annual Puhoi Pub to Club surf boat challenge on Saturday 1st November. Ten crews took part, including 3 women's crews.
- The 2nd annual National Jandal Day took place on 5th December as a fundraiser for surf lifesaving.
- In December, Red Beach lifeguards Karl Bogue & Ashleigh Allport travelled to Australia for the Annual Red Beach/Collaroy Lifeguard Exchange Scheme.
- In December, four Red Beach lifeguards were named in the SLSNR team to contest the biennial Trans-Tasman Series against NSW Country and Central Coast branches. Selected were Chris Moors, Dylan French, Caitlin Ryan and Elise Cuff.
- On January 10th, Red Beach won the 53rd Owen Chapman Cup Carnival by a margin of 53 points, giving the club its fifth consecutive win. A record 375 competitors took part including teams from NSW Country and Central Coast branches.
- The second annual Super Surf Camp was held at Red Beach on 12th/13th January. Aimed at youngsters aged from 8-14 years, it was conducted on the same lines as the JuniorSurf training camps held in Australia. Heading the camp was Brett Dowker, the Australian National High Performance head coach.
- At the NRC's held at Mt Maunganui during Anniversary Weekend, Red Beach finished in 7th spot, winning six titles. Could we ever forget the green sea lettuce washed up on the beach?
- At the Lion Foundation Surf League at Mt Maunganui on 7th/8th February, three Red Beach members competed in the rep teams. Chris Moors was selected for the SLSNR Open team, and in the U-19 team were Sam Cosgrove & AJ Maney.
- Selected for the SLSNR U-16 & U-14 teams at the Inter-Districts held at Mount Maunganui were:
 U16 Elise Cuff. U14 Joshua Pickering-Ross and Tyler Baldwin.
- At the Auckland Championships held at Ruakaka on 14/15 February, Red Beach Masters competitors won the inaugural Lifeguard Masters Points Trophy.

- Red Beach won the Up&Go Auckland JuniorSurf Championships at Orewa Beach on 22 February by a massive 334 points clear of its nearest rival. It was the second consecutive overall points win.
- At the SLSNZ U14 Ocean Athlete Championships held at Mount Maunganui in March, Red Beach collected 14 medals comprising 8 Gold, 3 Silver and 3 Bronze medals to finish in 3rd= place overall, the club's best-ever result. Red Beach's stand-out performer was Izaak Scheib who collected 4 gold medals in the U-11 age group.
- Red Beach won the Southern Trust Rookie Challenge for the third consecutive year. Competing at Omaha on 7th March, the five-person team was one of 22 club teams participating. Red Beach had a winning margin of 10 points. Another Red Beach team finished in 7th spot.
- On 8th March at Mairangi Bay, Red Beach's two JuniorSurf teams contesting the Cath & Eddie Millar Cup delivered a rare quinella by finishing first and second in the 2009 challenge. Eleven teams participated. It was the seventh consecutive occasion that Red Beach has won the cup.
- At the New Zealand Championships at Midway Beach, Gisborne in March, Red Beach finished in fourth spot on overall points, collecting 4 Gold, 6 Silver and 8 Bronze medals. Red Beach was the top finisher amongst the SLSNR clubs competing at Gisborne.
- In May, the club held its annual Prizegiving Night with fluoro as the theme.

CLUB PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Our 56th year may well be remembered more for activity off the beach, off the court and out of the water than would normally be the case. The 2008/09 season can fairly safely be labelled as the "year of the deck" as not since the present clubrooms were completed in 1982 has there been a similar level of building (and demolition) activity.

At the time of writing this report we have largely completed the deck construction - with some finishing work to be completed - and are half way through the revamp and extension of the downstairs ablutions. With this work completed, some new paint and curtains upstairs and in the foyer, a bit of a tidy-up of the tar seal and outside building area and some furniture for the deck (and possibly a coat of paint on the exterior) our total spend will be nearing \$200,000 plus numerous volunteer hours and donations of goods. This is/was Stage One of a three-stage project that also includes a revamp of the current kitchen, bar and lounge area and the construction of a third squash court. The all-up cost is estimated to be around the \$0.5 million mark, so with the coffers more than drained in completing Stage One we have some fairly serious fund raising to do to meet the aspirations of members for a truly top class facility.

Unfortunately, even surf life saving clubs are not immune from the current economic ills and with the incomes of the charitable trusts on whom we have relied so much for funding severely hit, we are increasingly having to look at other ways to raise funds and/or secure loans. As the annual accounts show, the turnaround in performance of the bar has been both satisfying and timely. Complemented by the excellent Friday night dinners and Sunday brunches served up by Greg and his team, the bar is now generating a fairly steady level of return that allows us to both improve the day to day club operation and continue to invest in the redevelopment of the club facilities. While it is hoped that the current contributions to club operations made by the three 'operating' divisions, Squash, SeniorSurf and JuniorSurf may eventually be 'retired' a decision was taken this year to maintain these while we are heavily investing in the club's redevelopment.

On the beach, our lifeguards completed 2,628 hours of lifeguarding, completing three rescues, four searches and 20 First Aid assistances. Perhaps equally importantly our patrols scored an average 98.6% in the five patrol audits over the length of the season. Red Beach members also filled 13 of the 81 Regional Lifeguard positions

Surf sports action kicked off in September with the 'petrol heads' again competing in the annual '90 Mile Beach Classic'. While maybe not a vintage season, we finished with the Owen Chapman Cup remaining in the cabinet, a second at the District Champs and a 4th (and best Northern Region club) in a very 'frustrating' National Champs. The real highlight, however, was the winning of the inaugural Masters trophy at the District Champs.

Although JuniorSurf numbers were down on previous seasons, this certainly wasn't reflected in results with the club making pretty much a clean sweep of everything entered including the District Champs, Cath and Eddie Millar Cup and Rookie Challenge plus a number of individual successes at the Ocean Athletes event.

Despite having to juggle play (and showers) around the current renovations to the downstairs ablutions, squash members have had another successful season hosting a number of tournaments and business house squash. Congratulations to Sarah Agi who has joined Lisa Cowlard in the New Zealand rankings. Thanks guys for your patience! The results will be worth the inconvenience.

Red Beach's contribution to the wider surf life saving community was recognised with Michelle Newton and Edwin Richards receiving SLSNZ Service Awards and Peter Olsen a SLSNR Service Award. Dean Pouwhare was a very deserving winner of the SLSNR Volunteer of the Year award.

In addition to those deservedly and 'officially' recognised, there are a number of people who have contributed to our ongoing success and perhaps none more so than Debra Cairns, our hard working and efficient club administrator. My thanks to Debra and all the other volunteers for their various contributions to the Red Beach club.

Many people will be aware of 'Project Groundswell' the current strategic review being undertaken across SLSNZ. The objectives of this review are to create a more efficient and sustainable movement from club through to national level that reduces the administrative burden on volunteers and hopefully delivers more enjoyment to members. While it appears most clubs in the Northern Region are in general agreement with the principles of Groundswell, there are some serious concerns about the proposed solutions. SLSNR are to be commended for the way that they have sought feedback from the clubs and Red Beach has been actively involved in all discussions and reviews to date. "Watch this space".

As always in June and July, the next surf season seems a long way away. The reality is, however, that our 57th season is only a little over two months away and there is an awful lot to be crammed into the remaining off-season to make next summer a success.

So, if you feel like you can contribute in some way to the current building project or some other aspect of YOUR club, don't feel embarrassed to put your hand up.
